# Unaccompanied visits

You need to bring your child to the front playground for 1:30pm.

If your child has and wants to wear the school uniform, that is fine.

If they want to wear plain clothes, this is fine too. They will need a drinks bottle (water only) with their name on and they will need to have sun cream (already applied) and a sun hat if necessary.

The teachers and LSA will come down to collect your child from you and we will walk them back up through the school for their afternoon experience.

At 3:00pm we shall bring your child back to you at the same spot at the front of the school.



## Home visits

Before your child starts on Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> September you will be offered a home visit. These will take place on:

- Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> September 2025 (pm only)
- Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> September 2025 (all day)
- Friday 5<sup>th</sup> September 2025 (all day)

The Class Teacher and the LSA will discuss any issues, concerns and individual needs that you would like to.



## Helpful stuff for you to know:

Please use the car park by Hopscotch. We encourage a one-way system around Church Lane onto Wangfield Lane.

Collect from the front playground at 3.20pm  
The pick-up time is staggered in order to ease traffic congestion at the end of the day.

Bring children around to the front playground from 8.50am

Fruit is provided free each day

The teacher and LSA will be there to greet you. We can help the child to walk up to the classroom where they will self-register and make their lunch choice. All infants are offered a free school meal each day.

Please notify the school office if your child will be absent for the day.

Milk is offered free to all children until the age of 5. Let us know of any dietary requirements/allergies; these will need to be registered with Education Caters on their website.

Please ensure emergency details are up to date.

Please notify us of any changes for collection at the end of the day by telephoning the school office or telling the Classteacher or LSA in the morning.

Please use the church yard thoroughfare carefully and respectfully.
