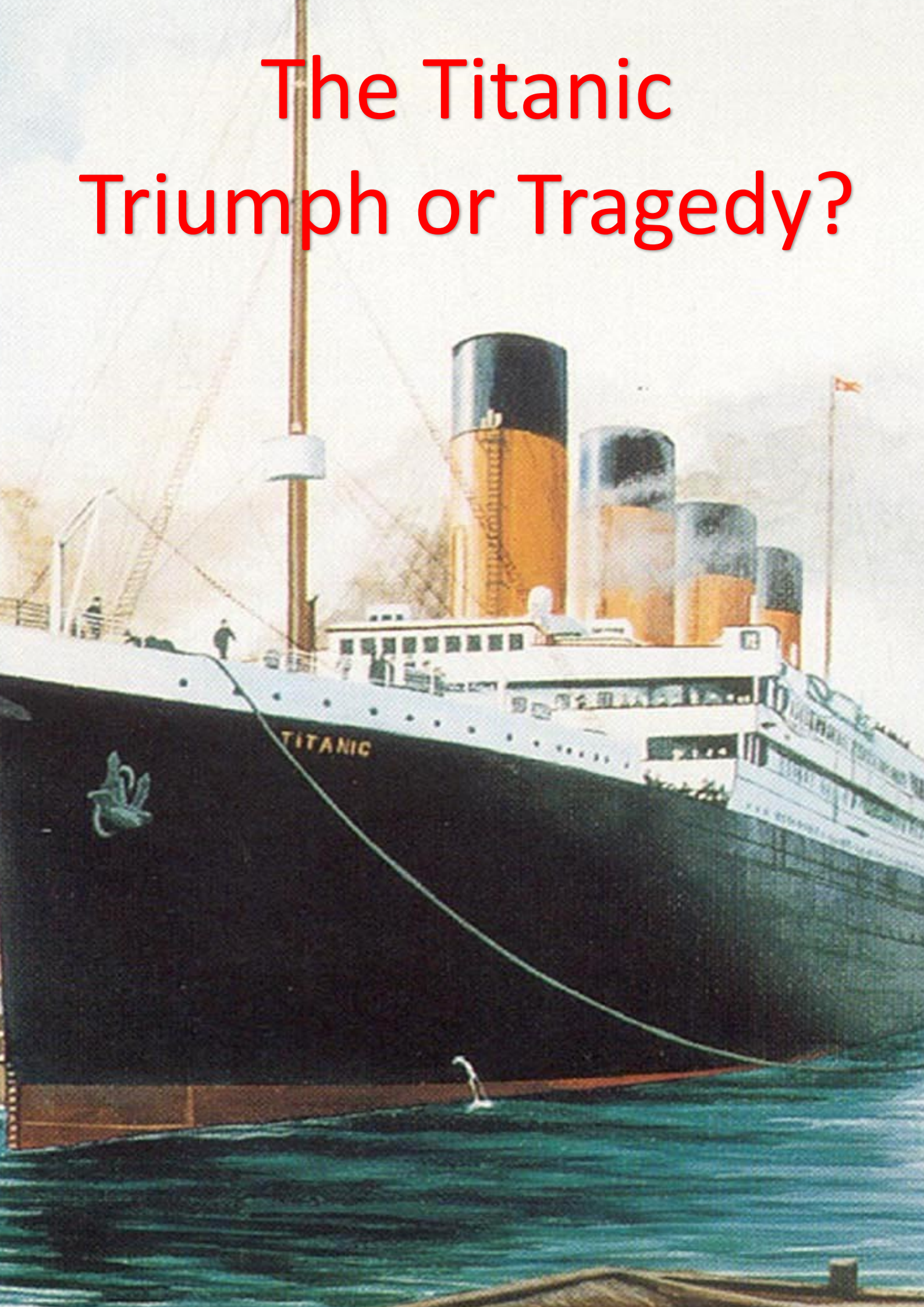


The Titanic Triumph or Tragedy?



Our Learning

The children will be hooked into the topic with a visit to the Sea City Museum where they will explore what life was like on board the Titanic and look at artefacts. This topic will provide children with the opportunity to explore the reasons why things happened in the past. They will embark on a 6 step enquiry answering a range of questions which includes: Why do we remember Titanic? Why was it so popular with both rich and poor and why did the 'unsinkable' sink?

History

During this topic the children will look at a range of sources and assess their reliability. They will conduct an enquiry and use evidence to make conclusions about the Titanic. The topic will conclude with them producing a presentation using multi-media to answer the question was the Titanic a Triumph or Tragedy?

English:

In English the children will create scripts to create a documentary explaining if the Titanic was a triumph or tragedy.



ICT

The children will learn how to use a range of multi-media to make a movie. They will use music, sound effects, voice overs, pictures and video to create a movie explaining whether the Titanic was a, Triumph or Tragedy?
