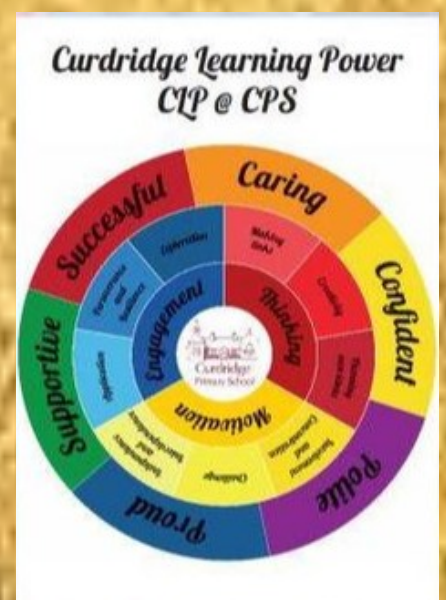




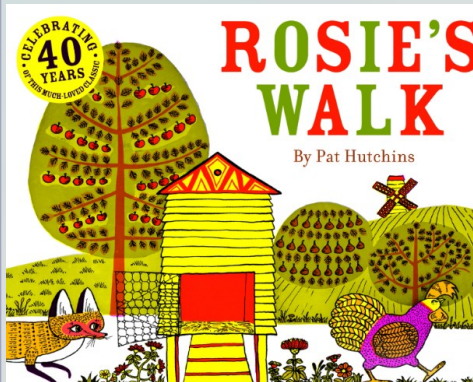

At the Farm

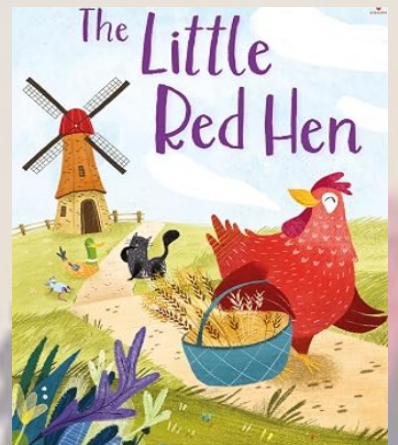


Our Learning

Our first topic of this year is 'At the Farm' and we have been able to give children the opportunity to experience a real farm by arranging an exciting visit to Manor Farm on Tuesday 29th September (more details to follow).



Our English work for this half term links closely to our topic and we will be using two farm-related stories; Rosie's Walk and 'The Little Red Hen'.



Children will be writing captions to accompany the illustrations in Rosie's Walk and then will be creating their own retell-

Geography

In Geography this half term we will be learning what a farm is and why they are important. We will be exploring different features of a farm and will be finding out about the different buildings found on a farm and identifying different land use.

We will also be learning about how the seasons affect life on a farm and will be learning about the points of a compass to help us navigate a farm map.

Art

In Art this half term we will be exploring different media to create our own self portraits.



DT

Our DT work will involve discovering the main ingredients of bread. We will be looking at different types of bread from around the world, focussing on shapes and textures. After this we will be designing and baking our own Harvest loaves linked to our RE work.



Science

For the first few weeks of this half term we will be naming and labelling body parts and investigating the human senses.

After this we will be exploring different types of animals, what they need to survive and learning the terms herbivore, carnivore and omnivore.
